ORDER:

The Hon'ble Chief Minister has announced on 02.06.2016 that for the benefit of farmers the Government of Tamil Nadu will implement the Price Support Scheme (PSS) for procurement of Copra from farmers, the Hon'ble Chief Minister has announced that the Tamil Nadu Co-operative Marketing Federation (TANFED), Agriculture Producers Co-operative Marketing Societies (APCMS) and Primary Agriculture Co-operative Credit Societies (PACCS) will procure copra through direct procurement centres at the Minimum Support Price (MSP) at Rs.59.50/kg for Milling copra and Rs.62.40/kg for Ball copra.

2. As per the guidelines issued by the Government of India, Ministry of Agriculture, Department of Agriculture & Cooperation for Price Support Scheme a notification has to be issued by the Government giving the details such as expected production, sowing area, average yield, peak arrival / harvesting period for the crops for which Minimum Support Price (MSP) is declared and the State Government is willing to implement the Price Support Scheme (PSS).

3. In the letter 2nd read above, the Commissioner of Agriculture has sent a proposal to notify the details of crop production of copra and average yield as detailed below:

> Government's The price policy agricultural commodities seeks to remunerative prices to the growers for their produce with a view to encourage higher investment and production and to safeguard the interest of consumers by making available supplies at reasonable prices with low cost of intermediation. The price policy also seeks to evolve a balanced and integrated price structure in the perspective of the overall needs of the economy.

> Towards this end, the Government of India announce a Minimum Support Price (MSP) for major agricultural commodities each year in both the Crop seasons after taking into account the recommendations of the Commission Agricultural Costs and Prices (CACP).

> In the scheme for the procurement of Copra in the year of 2016-2017 as per the guideline of Government of India, (Department of Agriculture and Cooperation) the notification regarding Crop calendar and Harvesting period of coconut in Tamil Nadu is to be required as part of proposal.

Therefore, Government of Tamil Nadu is willing to implement the Price Support Scheme(PSS) and its operation in Tamil Nadu and accordingly declare the following details:
